Book Exchange



SIR of the Month April

Earl D. Wilson, Jr. is a native Californian. He was born in San Francisco in 1939. He is the son of Earl D. Wilson and Juanita M. Wilson. He has one sister, Connie, who resides in New Zealand. He spent his early childhood in Rio Linda on the north side of Sacramento and then in 1951 he moved to Auburn with his family. He was one of the first students to attend E.V. Cain Middle School, located here in Auburn, as it was a new school at the time. He subsequently attended Placer High School.

Following his graduation from high school Earl entered the U.S. Navy. Among his duties he served as a Radioman on the USS Mt. Baker which was an ammunition transport ship. The ship was named for Mount Baker, a 10,781-foot high volcanic mountain in the Cascade Range of the state of Washington. The USS Mt. Baker was one of several ammunition ships named after volcanoes. From a limited perspective, it seems that serving on an ammunition ship in the middle of an ocean would be similar to; as the expression goes, "sitting on a powder keg". Hopefully, the names associated with the ships were not indicative of their actual be-



havior. Earl's deployments were mostly to the Western Pacific Ocean during the Cold War Era. After being discharged from the Navy, Earl returned to Auburn where he secured a job with the City of Auburn as a dispatcher for the police and fire departments. While working with the City he saw opportunities within the city government and worked for three different city managers as an assistant. Concurrently, Earl continued his education at Sierra College where he attained an Associate in Arts degree. He went on to attain a Bachelor of Arts degree at California State University, Sacramento. Later in life Earl attended California State University, Stanislaus where he attained a Master's degree in Public Administration.

Earl has two children and two grandchildren.

In 1968 Earl's career resulted in his moving from Auburn to work as the City Manager of four Central and Northern California cities over a period of 40 years. The cities were #1- Escalon, #2- Gustine, #3-Rio Dell, and #4-Weed. Escalon is in California's Central Valley just east of Manteca and west of Oakdale. Gustine is located further south in California's Central Valley, north of the San Luis Reservoir and the City of Los Banos, and just slightly east of I-5. Rio Dell, (not to be confused with Del Rio which is within a couple of miles of Escalon), is near the North Coast area of California on the Eel River and along Hwy 101, just to the south of Eureka and Fortuna. The City of Weed is located just slightly west of beautiful Mt. Shasta along I-5.

A common challenge Earl addressed as the City Manager of all four cities was the maintenance of a healthy economy. Escalon's, and Gustine's economies were predominately agriculturally based. Rio Dell's economy was primarily timber and fishing based. Weed's economy was based on timber and, as a college town, education. Some other challenges common to all four cities were providing for growth, maintaining, and improving services and infrastructure, and meeting the ever-changing state and federal laws and regulations. The diversity of Earl's work was extensive. Earl retired in 2012.

Following his retirement, Earl returned to Auburn, where he had roots, and where he had come throughout his career to visit his parents who resided in Auburn until their passing. Earl offered that: "Auburn was always a home to me." Earl observed from his experiences in other cities that the residents of various cities seem to take the same kind of pride in their community as the people of Auburn do in their community. He observed that most residents feel that their community is the best place to live. Earl concludes that the situation is a good thing; because if everyone thought the same place was the best place to live, there would be an extreme concentration of the earth's population living in one tiny point on our beautiful, and diverse, planet.

Earl has been a member of the SIRs Branch 37 since February of 2022.

Earl is a member of the Sierra Foothills Amateur Radio Club. He enjoys club events such as Field Day. Field Day is an annual campout, recurring since 1933. Club members gather each year, on the last full weekend in June, to practice the deployment and operation of radio communications equipment by making radio contacts with similar clubs and operators throughout the country. The club also has swap events. The club supports various non-profit organizations when the non-profits have events that could benefit from radio support for the safety and the convenience of the staff and the participants of the non-profit events.

Earl is a Trustee for the Auburn Public Cemetery District.

Earl is a member of the Auburn Rotary Club.

Earl has returned to not only Auburn; but also, to Placer High School. He is on the Placer Union High School Bond Oversight Committee.

Earl is also a member of the Auburn Chamber of Commerce.

For the Chamber of Commerce, Earl serves as the Chairman of the Auburn Family 4th of July Parade committee. He wholeheartedly invites and encourages SIRs members and their families to participate in the parade.

As to other activities and hobbies Earl participates in and enjoys.... Mentioned previously, Earl has two children and two grandchildren. Earl has shared that he likes to spend time with his children and grandsons as he feels that family should be the number one priority in a person's life.

Earl keeps busy. He revealed that he had never played a musical instrument until a few years ago. At that time, he started taking piano lessons and those lessons occupy his time in an enjoyable way. He believes the engagement in piano lessons is another way he addresses remaining young. Earl demonstrates that we are never too old to continue learning.

Earl's willingness to share his inspiring bio with us is very much appreciated. Now, being aware of interests and experiences you may have in common with Earl, the door is open for interactions with him, and the sharing of the details associated with your common experiences and interests. Our Sirs activities: Bocci, Poker, Golf, Dinning Out, Science & Technology, etc. provide excellent opportunities to interact with others and to make new friends.
